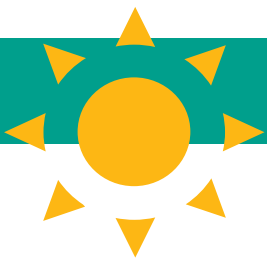

Melanoma Institute Australia's national SunSafe Student Ambassador Program is a comprehensive, one-day workshop that trains representative students in the importance of sun safety and develops their public speaking skills.

The workshop empowers students to deliver a sun safety presentation to their peers and champion a change in sun safe culture within their school community.

## THE SUNSAFE STUDENT AMBASSADOR PROGRAM:

- Includes training from a clinician and a presentation skills expert.
- Requires minimal input from teachers (we know you're busy!).
- Fulfils PDHPE curriculum outcomes (see back page) and a student leadership opportunity.
- Empowers students to deliver an engaging pitch to their peers.
- Helps students to support sun safety practices in their school and change attitudes about tanning.
- Supports student wellbeing by educating on how to prevent deadly melanoma.

Teachers are invited to bring with them 3-5 students from Years 8-10 to represent their school in a collaborative learning environment with other local students.

**Our SunSafe Student Ambassador Program** will develop students' skills in a range of areas, fulfil curriculum requirements and support student wellbeing.

## STUDENTS WILL DEVELOP THEIR:

- ✓ Presentation skills and confidence.
- ✓ Self-management skills through decision-making and problem solving.
- ✓ Interpersonal skills through collaboration, leadership and social awareness.

## CURRICULUM OUTCOMES:

### PDHPE Stage 4

- **PD4-6:** Recognises how contextual factors influence attitudes and behaviours and proposes strategies to enhance health, safety, wellbeing and participation in physical activity.
- **PD4-7:** Investigates health practices, behaviours and resources to promote health, safety, wellbeing and physically active communities.
- **PD4-8:** Plans for and participates in activities that encourage health and a lifetime of physical activity.
- **PD4-10:** Applies and refines interpersonal skills to assist themselves and others to interact respectfully and promote inclusion in a variety of groups or contexts.

### PDHPE Stage 5

- **PD5-2:** Researches and appraises the effectiveness of health information and support services available in the community.
- **PD5-6:** Critiques contextual factors, attitudes and behaviours to effectively promote health, safety, wellbeing and participation in physical activity.
- **PD5-7:** Plans, implements and critiques strategies to promote health, safety, wellbeing and participation in physical activity in their communities.
- **PD5-8:** Designs, implements and evaluates personalised plans to enhance health and participation in a lifetime of physical activity.
